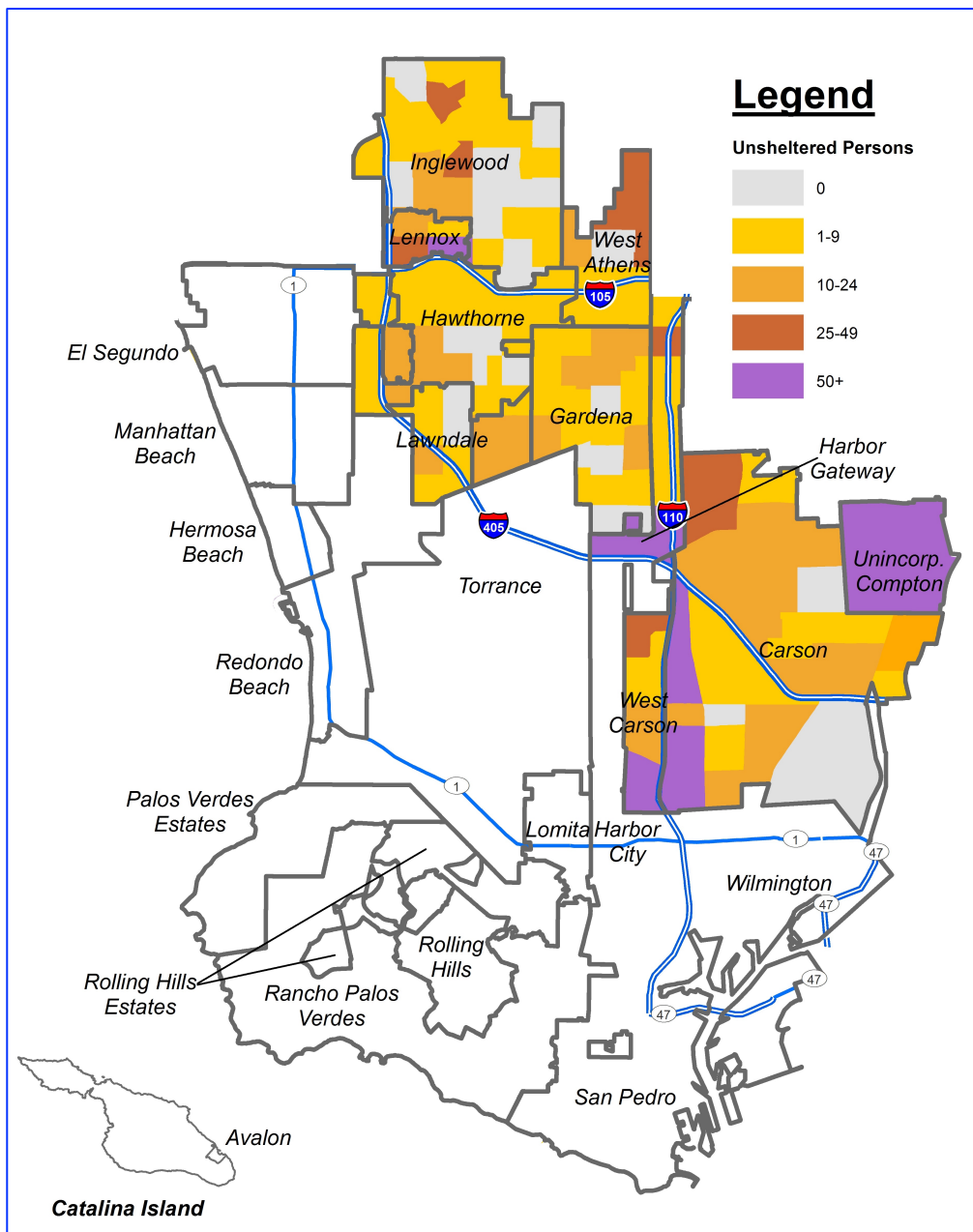

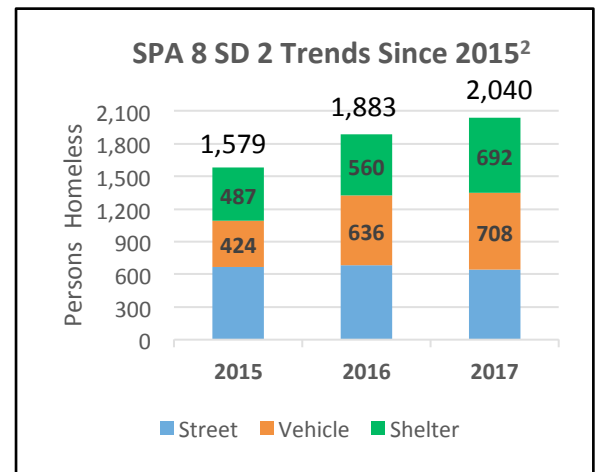
48% of persons experiencing homelessness in the SD 2 portion of SPA 8 were in County Unincorporated areas

Those unincorporated areas saw a 9% increase since 2016 (895 to 974).

51% of persons experiencing homelessness in SPA 8 were in SD 2

Including the following SD 2 percentages of SPA 8:

- Emergency Shelter: 83%¹
- Transitional Shelter: 57%
- Street: 47%
- Vehicles: 41%

¹ Of the 660 SPA 8 non-DV Emergency Shelter and Transitional Housing placements on January 25, 2017, 547 of them (83%) were in SD 2. 524 of those programs were in families with children and utilized DPSS CalWorks Temporary Assistance Program vouchers, and an additional 161 individuals used DPSS GR Homeless Temporary Assistance Program vouchers.

² The number of DPSS vouchers used increased by 262 on January 25, 2017. The total number of shelter beds was offset somewhat by the decrease in a Veteran's transitional program by 132 that converted to permanent housing last year.

³ These 126 Veterans were placed into permanent housing via coordinated entry referrals to Veteran system partners, such as VA and SSVF organizations.
