


# 2017 Greater Los Angeles Homeless Count

# 4,282 Homeless Persons in the Los Angeles Continuum of Care's (CoC's) South Bay/Service Planning Area (SPA) 8<sup>†</sup>

#### Fast Facts About SPA 8's Homeless Count Changes from 2016

- Overall homelessness rose by 17%; the vehicle homelessness total increased by the same rate.
- The South Bay's unsheltered population is now two-thirds (66%) larger than Skid Row's.
- The number of motel vouchers used the night of the Count rose 244%. That increase reflected in the shelter homelessness totals.
- Chronic homelessness increased by 5% overall, from 25% to 30%. That is now equivalent to the LA CoC rate of 30%.
- January 25, 2017 was an unusually cold night, with temperatures dipping down to 41° F across Los Angeles. Anecdotally, fewer people were on the streets than in the previous week.



22% or 832 Have a physical disability




**7% or 318** Are veterans
