

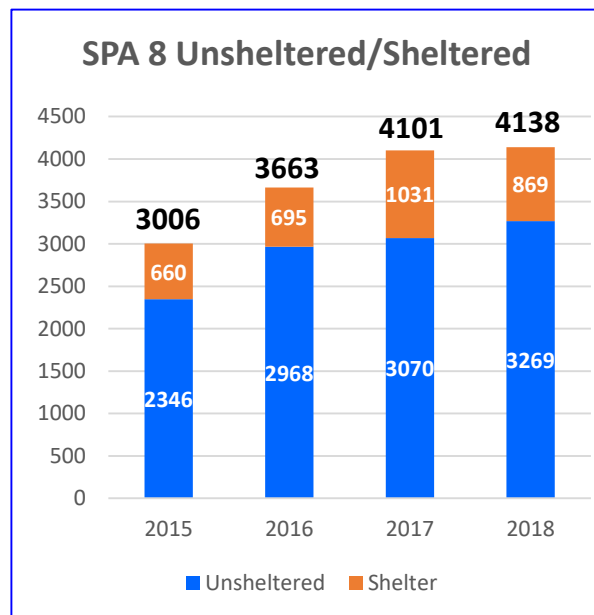


# 2018 Greater Los Angeles Homeless Count

## 4,138 Homeless Persons in the Los Angeles Continuum of Care's (CoC's) South Bay/Service Planning Area (SPA) 8†

### Fast Facts About SPA 8's Homeless Count Changes from 2017

- Overall homelessness rose by 1%, including a 6% rise in vehicular homelessness.
- The South Bay's unsheltered population is 56% larger than Skid Row's.
- The number of chronic homelessness persons decreased by 31% (1,405 to 973).
- The Shelter count in 2017 was unusually high because of the motel voucher utilization Countywide. When this is factored out, the SPA 8 sheltered total between 2017 and 2018 rose 17% (498 to 583), due to increased Veteran transitional shelter bed usage.



† The Los Angeles CoC does not include Long Beach, Glendale or Pasadena. SPA 8's data does not include the 1,863 homeless persons found in Long Beach.

### What are their ages?

Have a serious mental illness

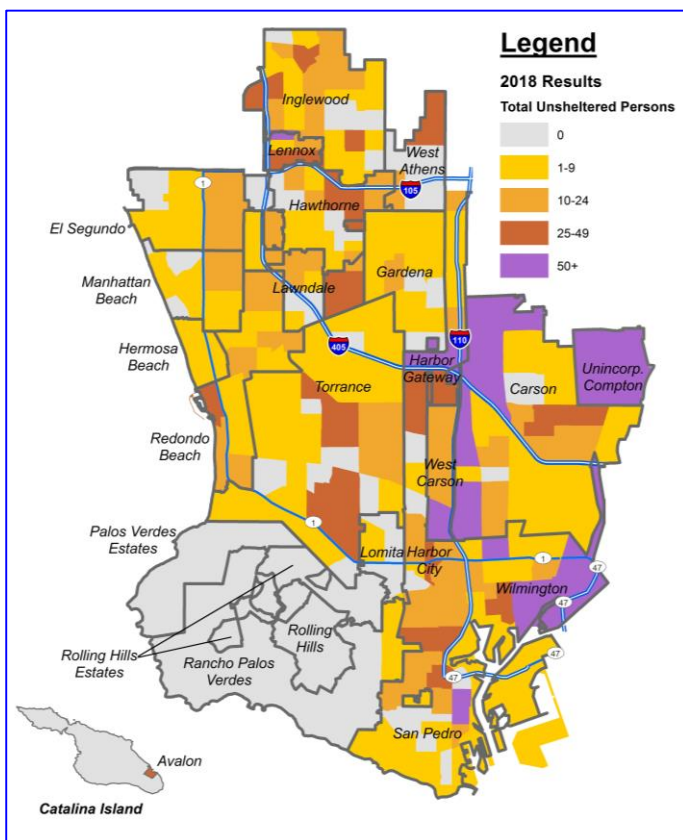
