## 1. Why the Homeless Count (HC) Numbers are Important

- **Nationally:** The HC are the official data reported to HUD
- **County:** In Los Angeles County, they are used to:
  - Target services to special populations
  - Track trends, help evaluate service and housing program effectiveness
  - Allocate public funding, including Measure H
- **Locally:** In SPA 8, we focus on each community's unique homelessness challenges, and the entire SPA as a region

## 2. Keeping HC Data in Perspective

- The Homeless Count is a “point-in-time” census held in late January
  - The numbers **fluctuate** throughout the year and...
  - They **don't provide a good sense of flows** into and out of homelessness throughout the year (CES is better at tracking that)
- The demographic numbers often do not trend up or down in adjacent years
  - **Examine “prevalence”** (or proportion) for a fuller perspective
- SPA 8's trends often do not follow those at LA CoC level

## Other Data Notes

- The Coalition’s trending starts with HC 2015
  - SPA 8 canvassed 100% of tracts that year for the 1<sup>st</sup> time; repeated thereafter (i.e., *no* census tract extrapolation for the street count)
  - LAHSA started conducting annual counts (previously only in odd numbered years per HUD requirement)
- “SPA 8” to us is “LA County’s SPA 8 minus City of Long Beach”
  - Long Beach holds biennial Counts
  - Different methodology used for HC demographics
- LAHSA is the HC’s lead organizer and supplier of raw data

### 3. HC 2019 Highlights for the Los Angeles Continuum of Care (LA CoC)

- As a reminder, LA CoC includes: all of Los Angeles County *minus* the cities of Glendale, Pasadena, and Long Beach
- Overall homelessness from 2018 to 2019:
  - **LA CoC went up by 13%** from 50,385 to 56,257
  - **LA County went up by 12%** from 53,195 to 58,936

## Other 2019 Highlights - LA CoC

- These data are only available at the LA CoC level only (not at the SPA-level). 2018 (calendar year):
  - **23% experienced homelessness for first time**
    - 53% of them said it was due to “Economic Hardship”
  - **68% have been in LA County 10+ years, 75% for 5+ years**




**Fast Stat:**





### Fast Stats:

- LA CoC's "Street" unsheltered saw a dramatic increase of 28% since 2018
- Over that same time period, SPA 8's "Street" unsheltered numbers rose by 4%

## Unsheltered Living in Vehicles



- "Vehicles" includes Cars, Van, RVs
- Each "vehicle unit" total is multiplied by the average number of people living in each vehicle type to get the "people in vehicles" total
- These "multipliers" are calculated each year
  - Calculation geographies: From 2015 to 2018: CoC level; 2019: SPA level





## “Sheltered” components:

- Emergency Shelter
  - Also called in Los Angeles:
    - “Crisis Housing”
    - “Interim Housing”
    - “Bridge Housing”
    - “Recuperative Beds”
- Transitional Housing
- Safe Havens

*Note: Individual shelter programs are listed in Homeless Inventory Count (HIC). It has not yet been released.*





### Fast Stats about % Females





### Fast Facts about SPA 8 for 2019:

- Unaccompanied minors went to zero because of runaway shelter moving to SPA 5








### **SPA 8 Veteran Notes**

- US Veterans Initiative/Inglewood has a large facility. Its bed configuration changes annually based on VA funding.
- Its shelter count numbers heavily affect SPA 8's overall Vet number. It is a "County Resource," so Vets not just from SPA 8.

**Unsheltered SPA 8 Vet homelessness declined by 41% from 2018, and 65% from 2017.**









### **City/Community Level Results: Notes**

- Unsheltered youth, persons residing in DV shelters, or sheltered persons using motel vouchers were excluded from City/Community level results
- The following City/Community Level results based on LAHSA's Community Dashboard as of 6-23-2019, which shows data from Jan. 2016 thru Jan. 2019
  - When the 2019 tract-level dataset is released, SBCEH's city-level data will be recalculated
  - Due to rounding differences between SBCEH and LAHSA, the data may be slightly different

## City/Community Level Results: Notes

- **Keep city/community numbers in perspective**
  - Based on point-in-time night time census
  - We know some people migrate between cities
    - Especially those living in vehicles

## City/Community Level Results: Methodology (1 of 2)

- For the HC 2019, LAHSA refined city/community borders to more accurately reflect political boundaries
  - New Boundary Source: Los Angeles Times Neighborhood dataset
  - Those changes were retroactively applied using the updated borders for the 2016 through 2018 HCs
  - Many cities had minor changes to their numbers
  - **Most impacted:** Harbor Gateway, Harbor City, Wilmington, San Pedro, Hawthorne, Lennox, Westmont/West Athens, Alondra Park, Unincorporated Compton

- City staff may submit information or change requests to [datasupport@lahsa.org](mailto:datasupport@lahsa.org)
  - Additional follow-up may be forthcoming
- SBCEH will continue working with LAHSA on making updates to city/community dashboard information
  - LAHSA is working to make corrections, but at present its priority is on 2019 HC
  - The following tables (and our upcoming City 1-Pager data sheets) will reflect our regional understanding

## Invitation To View City-Level Results Differently


- Homelessness is very complex: one number cannot adequately characterize the situation
- Unpacking the city-level results reveals different solutions
  - Sheltered vs Unsheltered Homelessness
  - “Street” vs Vehicular Homelessness
- While homelessness is viewed as a “City” problem, consider viewing sub-regional homelessness for shared solutions



## Closing Remarks

- Homeless Count 2019 reflects a full 24-months of “Measure H” expansion
