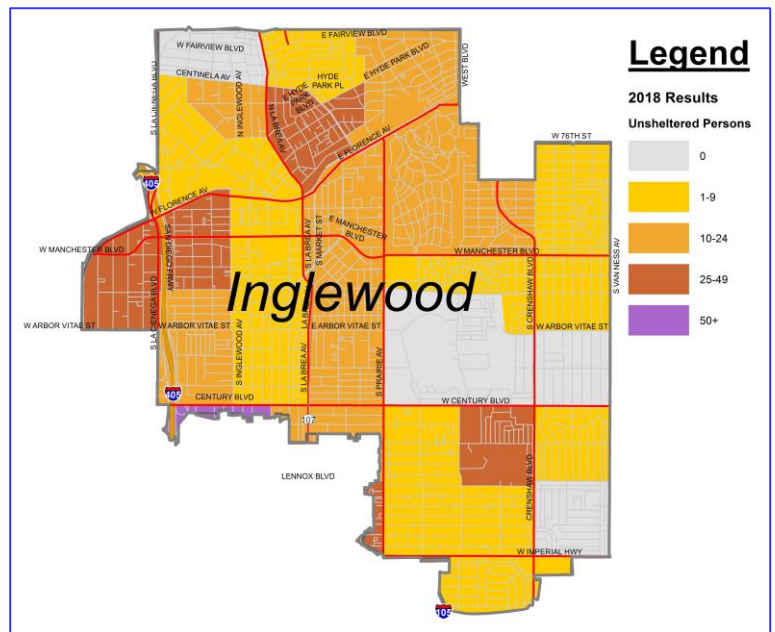
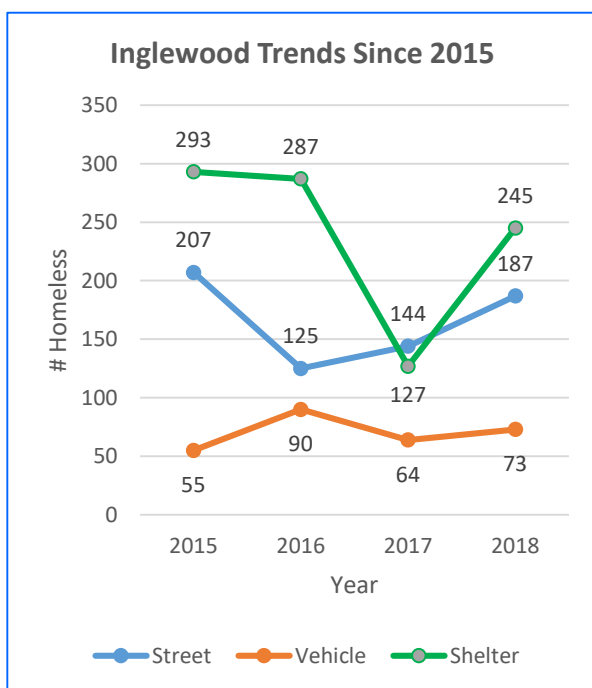

Fast Facts

- The area known as “Manchester Square” was completely fenced off one week before the Homeless Count, displacing a large vehicle encampment area into neighboring communities.
- US Veterans Initiative in Inglewood reconfigured its shelter program, providing more transitional beds in 2018.
- There was a Winter Shelter Program operating in Inglewood that accounted for the emergency shelter numbers.
