
Fast Facts


- Overall homeless in Redondo Beach declined: ...41% since 2017 ...29% since 2016
- For the Beach Cities consisting of El Segundo, Manhattan Beach, Hermosa Beach and Redondo Beach, unsheltered homelessness decreased from 307 in 2017 to 230 in 2018.
