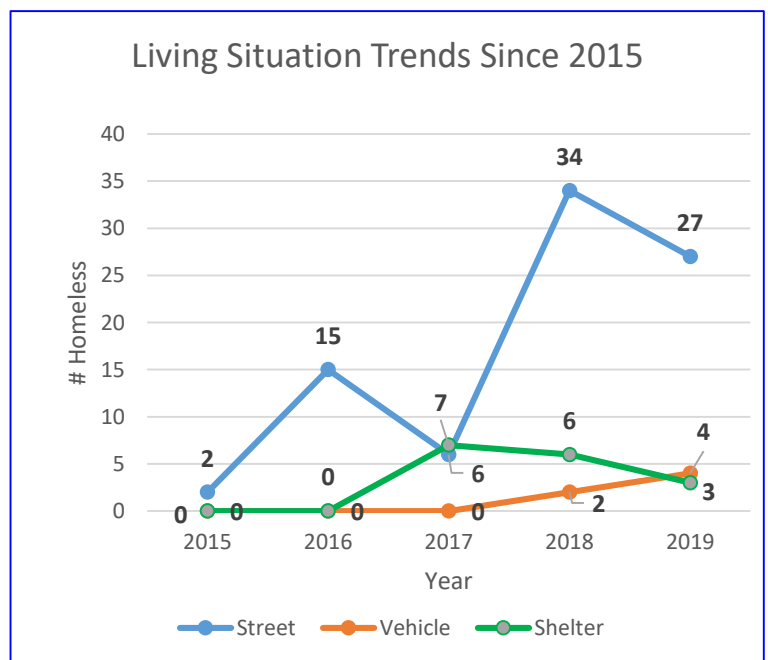
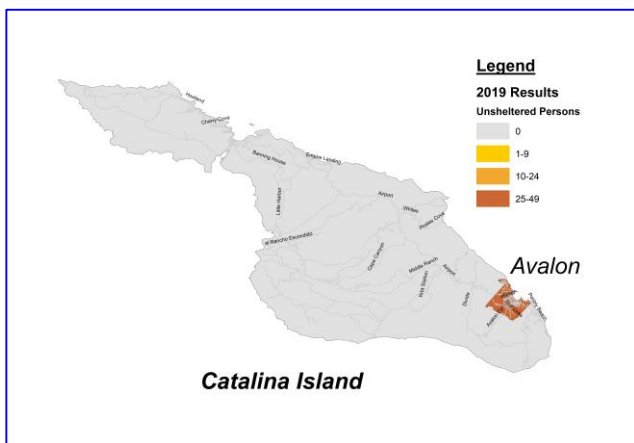
## Catalina Island/City of Avalon
