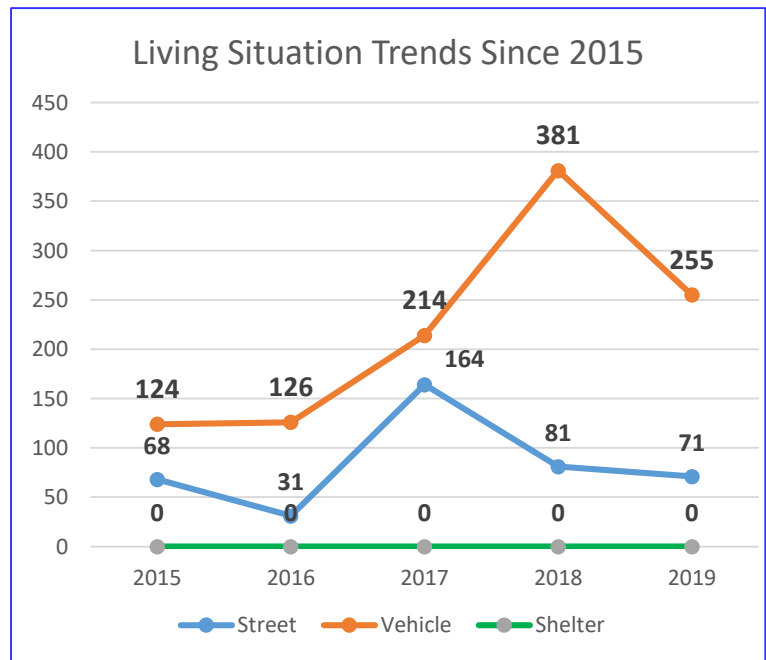
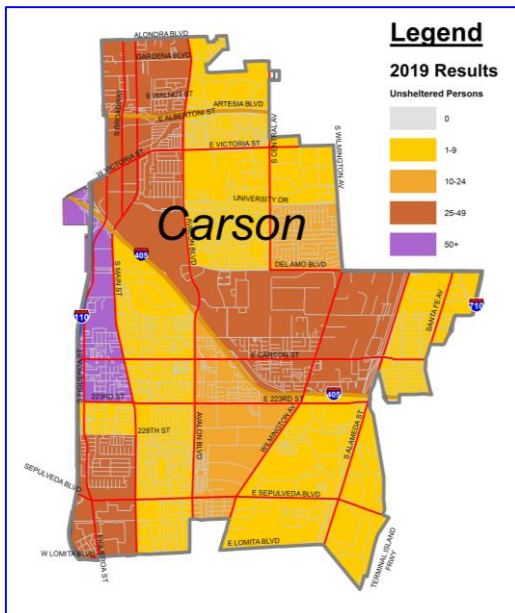
## City of Carson

### 326 Persons Experiencing Homelessness on January 23, 2019

#### Changes since 2018

- Vehicular homelessness in Carson decreased by 33%, while unsheltered street homelessness went down by 12%.
- There was consistent engagement from the Sheriff's department over the last year in addressing homelessness in the city.
