

## 2019 Greater Los Angeles Homeless Count


# Harbor City Neighborhood (City of Los Angeles) 153 Persons Experiencing Homelessness on January 23, 2019


## **Changes since 2018**

- Unsheltered street homelessness rose by 241% in one year (from 34 to 116). This increase is in large part due to the clearing of a large encampment in West Carson that borders Harbor City.
- Unsheltered homelessness in the South Bay part of LA City Council District 15 rose by 32% (from 1,306 to 1,723). Unsheltered street homelessness rose there by 43%, while vehicular homelessness rose by 41%.
