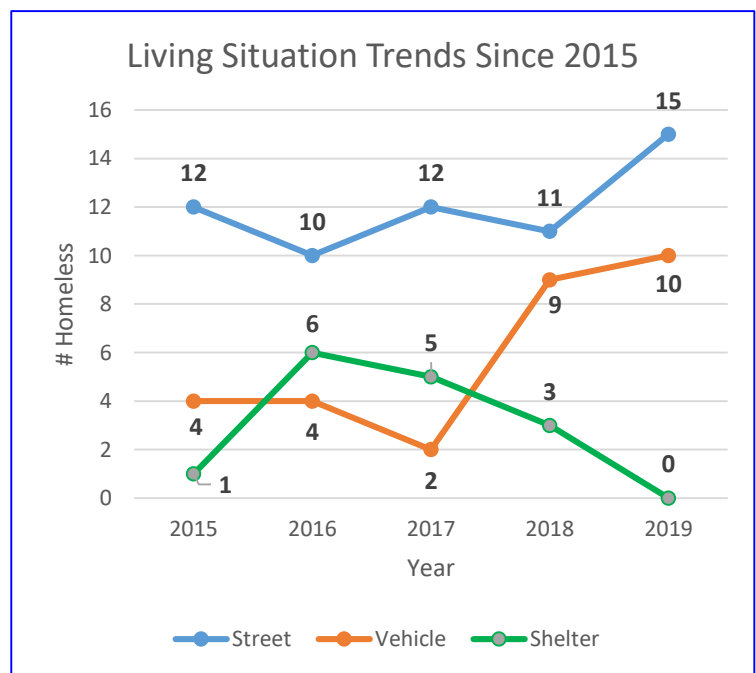
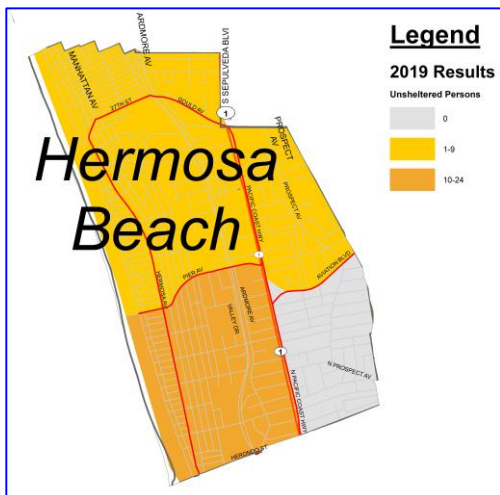

25 Persons Experiencing Homelessness on January 23, 2019

Changes since 2018

- For the Beach Cities of El Segundo, Manhattan Beach, Hermosa Beach, and Redondo Beach, unsheltered homelessness remained effectively level, from 230 persons in 2018 to 239 persons in 2019.
- However, there was one change in the composition of Beach City homelessness: An 11% increase in the number of persons living in vehicles this past year, from 114 to 126.
- The runaway youth emergency shelter, previously in Hermosa Beach, moved to a different region in 2018.
