
461 Persons Experiencing Homelessness on January 23, 2019


Changes since 2018

- Unsheltered homelessness in Inglewood decreased by 9% since 2018 (from 260 to 237).
- ➤ The nature of the City's unsheltered living situation changed dramatically: street homelessness went down 36%, while vehicular homelessness rose 60%.
