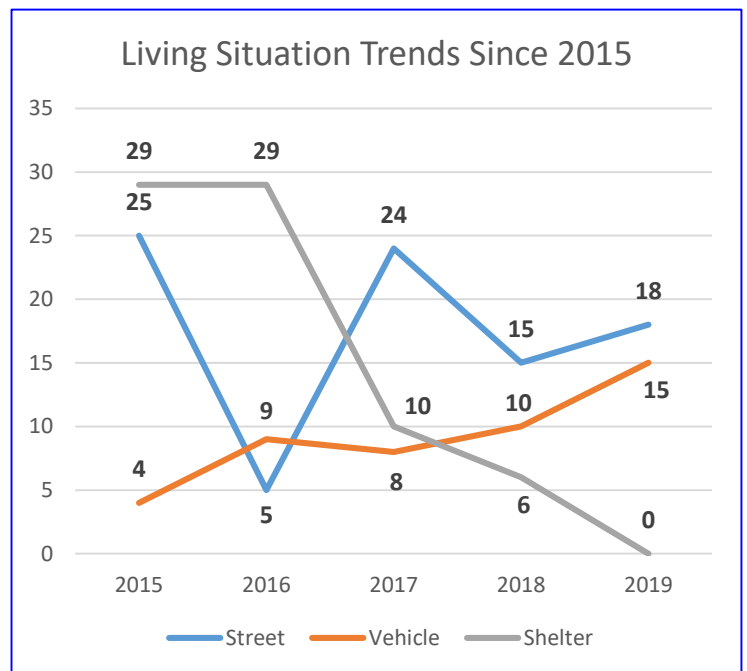
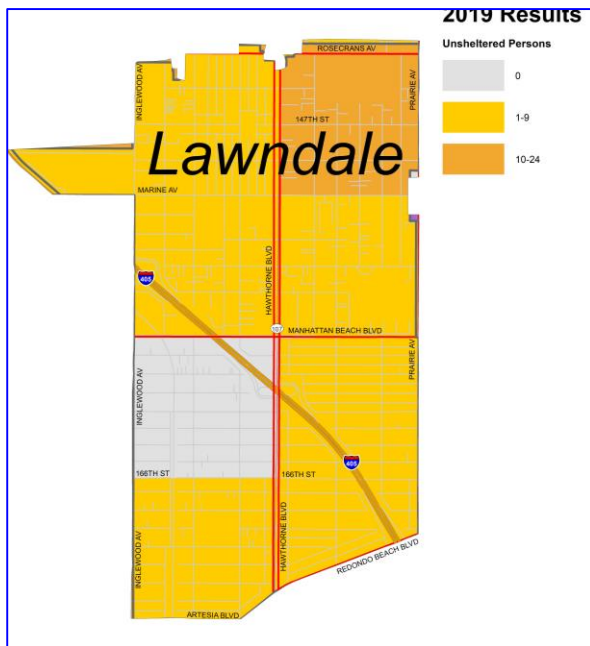

Changes from 2018

- While the number of persons experiencing homelessness is about the same as last year, the nature of it has changed: there was a 50% rise in the number of persons living in vehicles.
- The House of Yahweh transitional shelter homeless program closed in 2018, but it still provides food and other services to those in need.
