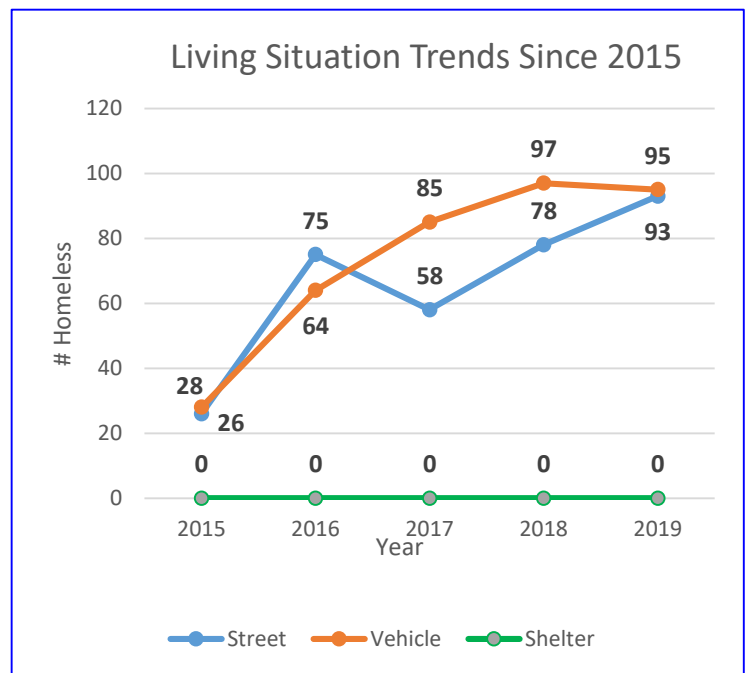
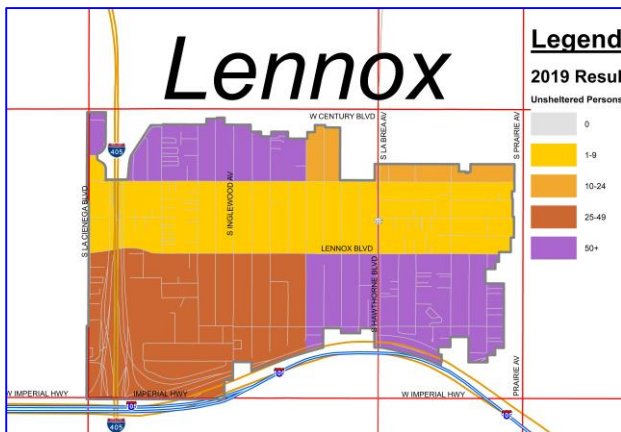

188 Persons Experiencing Homelessness on January 23, 2019

Changes since 2018

- While homelessness in Lennox rose by 7%, a larger percentage of persons (19%) are living in their vehicles than last year.
- The nearby “Manchester Square” area was closed off in 2017 to make way for new LAX parking. More RVs continue to be displaced from that area into Lennox.
