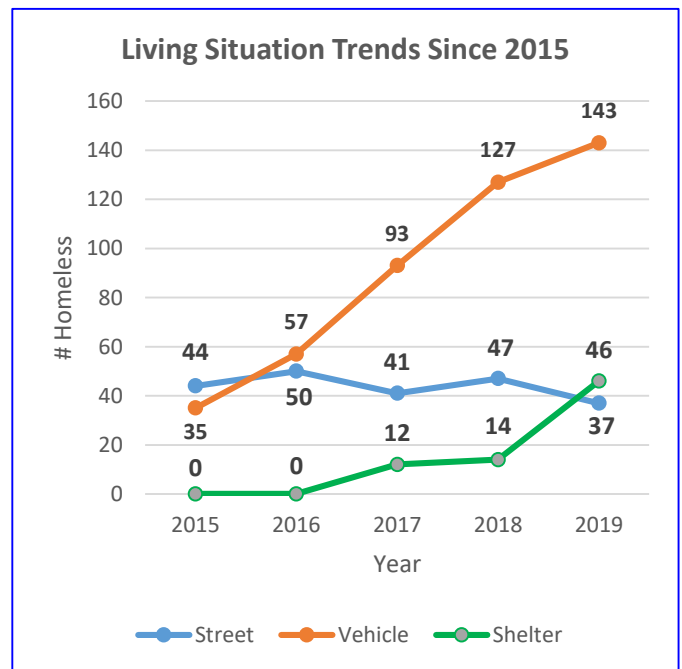
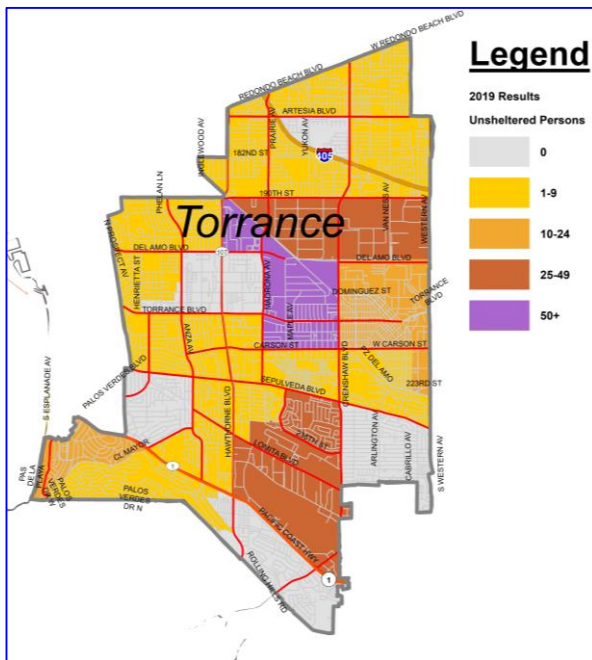

Changes since 2018

- Two new interim housing programs (considered emergency shelter) opened in Torrance. They provide recuperative care beds.
- Unsheltered homelessness rose by 2%.
- People living in vehicles rose by 13%.
