
Unincorporated West Carson 96 Persons Experiencing Homelessness on January 23, 2019


Changes since 2018

- Street homelessness in West Carson decreased by 63%, while vehicular homelessness went down by 36%.
- ➤ There was consistent engagement from the Sheriff's department over the past year in addressing homelessness in this incorporated area.
- People living in a large long-standing encampment in the southern area of West Carson moved across the street. As a result of the move, those persons were included in Harbor City (City of Los Angeles) during the 2019 Count.
