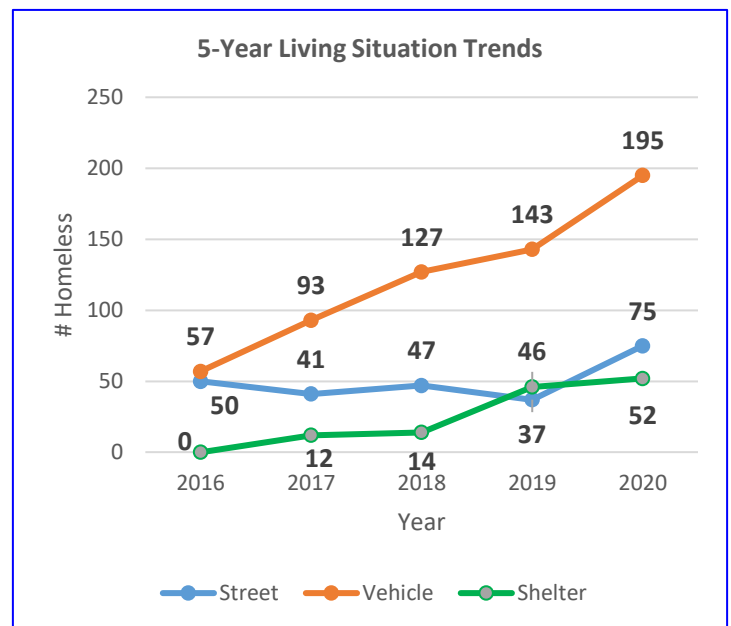
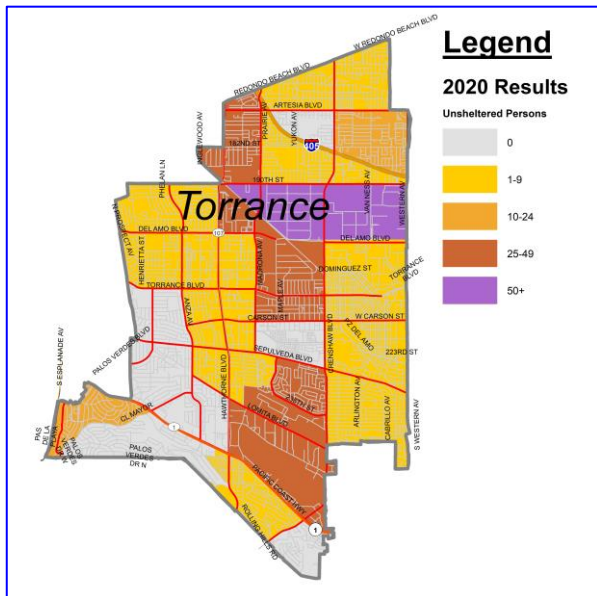
322 Persons Experiencing Homelessness on January 22, 2020

Changes since 2019

- Overall homelessness increased by 42%, primarily driven by the rise in street (+103%) and vehicular homelessness (+36%).
- Torrance ranks #2 in largest number of people living in vehicles in a South Bay municipality, behind the City of Los Angeles' SPA 8 footprint.
- Family Promise of the South Bay has two programs, one in Torrance and San Pedro. In 2020, LAHSA attributed the Homeless Count for both programs to Torrance's sheltered number (location of its administrative office). To more accurately reflect the Transitional Shelter total in Torrance, this table reflects the decrease of the 10 persons who were sheltered in this San Pedro program.

Notes

1. In 2019, LAHSA changed the city/neighborhood boundaries and then retroactively applied these to the 2016-2018 Counts. The table and graph reflect the original Count results reported for those years, and hence may be different from LAHSA's Community data. SBCEH rounds the data differently than LAHSA, which might also result in slightly different reporting numbers.
2. The following results are reported at the SPA level only: Domestic Violence Shelters, Youth Count results, and DPSS-issued motel vouchers.
3. Unaccompanied Minors on the Street data is only available at the SPA/Regional level.
