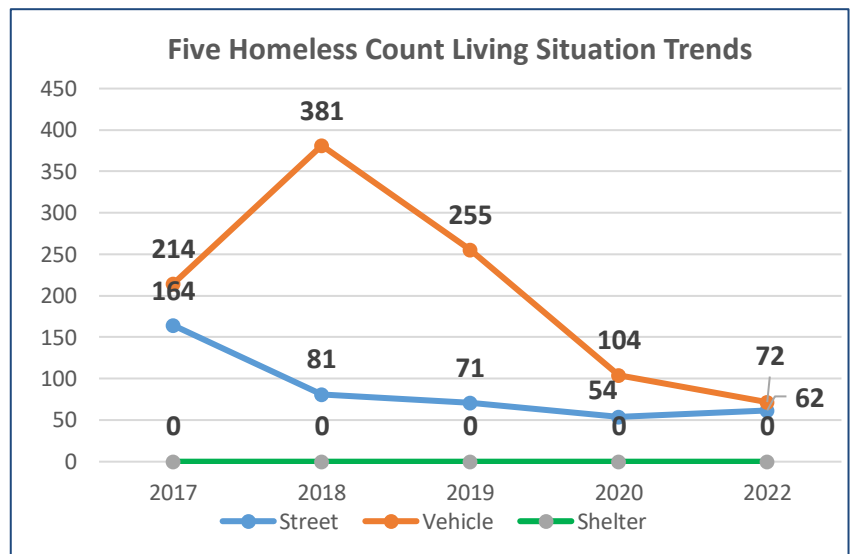
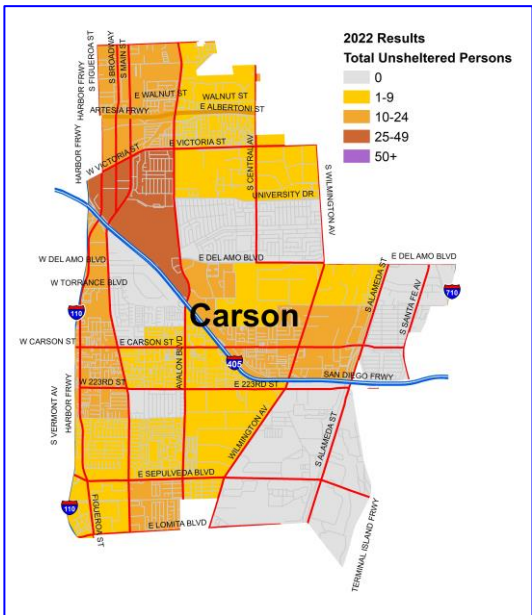
133 Persons Experiencing Homelessness on February 23, 2022

Changes since 2020

- Overall homelessness declined by 16% continuing a four-Count trend, driven by a 31% decrease in people living in vehicles.
- In the “Greater Carson” subregion that includes the unincorporated areas of West Carson and Compton, unsheltered homelessness decreased 33%.

- In 2019, LAHSA changed the city/neighborhood boundaries and then retroactively applied these to the 2016-2018 Counts. The table and graph reflect the original Count results reported for those years, and hence may be different from LAHSA’s Community data. SBCEH rounds the data differently than LAHSA, which might also result in slightly different reporting numbers.
 - The following results are reported at the SPA level only: Domestic Violence Shelters, Youth Count results, and DPSS-issued motel vouchers.
 - Unaccompanied Minors on the Street data is only available at the SPA/Regional level.
 - The 2021 unsheltered count was canceled because of the COVID-19 pandemic. The 2022 was delayed one month because of the Omicron variant surge.
